

Britain's Rural Muslims: Exploring the Dynamics of Faith and Place in the 21st Century

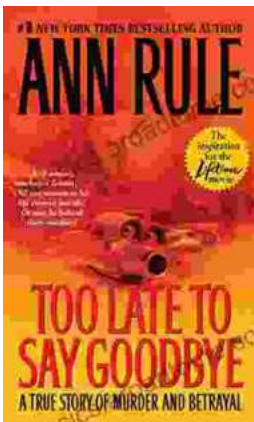

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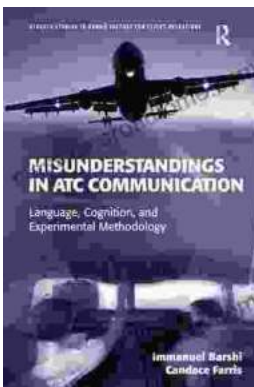
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
