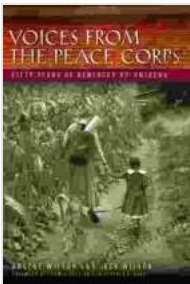

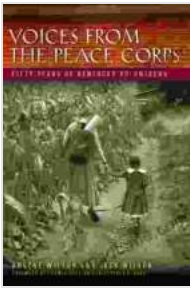
Profound Impact

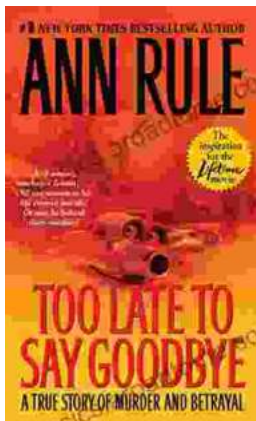

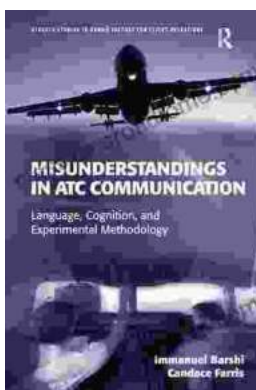
